

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The northwest quarter of the park contains the ruins of Fort Lowell a U. S. Army Post that was established in 1873 and abandoned in 1891. Fort Lowell was primarily a support and headquarters post for the Camps and Forts of the southwest engaged in the Indian Wars of the 1880's. Fort Lowell contributed to the economic and social growth of Tucson.
