PUBLIC HEARING: MAJOR STREETS AND ROUTES PLAN AMENDMENT TO ELIMINATE THE FUTURE RIGHT-OF-WAY SEGMENT OF W. GORET (WARD 3)

This is a public hearing on a proposed amendment, as requested by the City of Tucson Planning and Development Services Department, to amend the existing Major Streets and Routes (MS&R) Plan by eliminating the future right-of-way segment that extends through the Prince 10 Planned Area Development (PAD) between the Santa Cruz River and Interstate-10.

The Prince 10 PAD (PAD-43) was adopted by Mayor and Council on September 28, 2021, to facilitate a 110-acre mixeduse, interstate commerce campus. The property owner has plans to submit a development package to establish a private street network within the boundaries of Prince 10 (PAD-43) (Attachment E). However, in order to purchase the necessary right-of-way from the City of Tucson, and create the private street network, an amendment to the MS&R is required as part of the right-of-way abandonment process given this segment of W. Goret Road intercepts Prince 10 development area. This amendment will enable the developer to establish a private roadway network and further the development of the Prince 10 PAD project.
