DEFENDANTS IN DV COURT:

The Courthouse is closed to the public through June 1, 2020.

After this date, we will be attempting to limit the number of people attending court. We will be able move hearings and you won't have to attend, if you stay in touch and are doing well.

Unless you have received notice that you do not need to attend your hearing, you must be present or a warrant may issue for your arrest.

DO NOT COME TO COURT EARLY- WE ARE SPACING THE HEARINGS OUT TO ENSURE SOCIAL DISTANCING SAFETY.

To make sure you don't get a warrant and we know where you are:

If you have a case pending (still open and active) or a probation revocation in DV Court- call your attorney!
