How Do I Get the Immobilizing Device Removed from My Vehicle?

- 1. Pay your fines; or
- 2. Go to Court:

Collection fees and a \$75 immobilization fee are added to the fines and fees for the parking citations that are in default.

There is a \$500.00 charge for damaged or stolen immobilizing devices, in addition to other fines and fees due.

When will the Immobilizing Device be Removed?

Once you pay your fines or go to Court, the immobilizing device will be removed.

It will be removed by the end of the business day (Mon–Fri) when fees and fines due are paid prior to 4:30 PM. Payments received after that time will result in the immobilizing device being removed the next business day between 8:00 AM and 9:00 AM.

Immobilization devices will <u>not</u> be removed before 8:00 AM, after 4:30 PM, or on weekends.

What's This On My Vehicle? Why Was It Put There?

The vehicle has been immobilized because the owner has three (3) or more unpaid parking citations. The City of Tucson has made every effort to contact you and arrange for the payment of these violations, but has received no response. The citations remain unpaid.

Tucson City Code (Sections 20-203 and 20-204) authorizes the immobilization of the vehicle until all outstanding fines and fees are paid.

Do I Have To/ Can I Go To Court?

appearance is necessary if you have made arrangements to pay the fines and fees over the telephone with a City Court Representative, (520) 791-4216.

Yes if you wish to go to court, you should appear at Tucson City Court, 103 E. Alameda St., at the date and time listed on the sticker that has been placed on driver's side window of the vehicle. The purpose of this hearing is to determine whether the vehicle driver owned the vehicle at the time the original citations were issued. If, after this hearing, the case is continued, another hearing date will be set for within 30 days.

What if I Don't Get to Tucson City Court?

If the vehicle is still immobilized 48 hours after the immobilizing device was installed, it will be towed from this parking space by

A state-issued identification, a receipt from Tucson City Court, and a current vehicle registration or vehicle title will be needed to retrieve a vehicle from Frontier Towing after fees and fines due have been paid. If the person picking up the vehicle is not the owner, they must also have a notarized authorization from the vehicle owner to redeem the vehicle.

The vehicle's owner is responsible for any towing charges. Payments for towing charges are payable directly to Frontier Towing.
