As Monsoon Season starts to bring moisture into Tucson, crews from The Department of Transportation and Mobility Streets Maintenance Division deliver more than 500 barricades to approximately 150 dip crossings throughout the City.

During Operation Splash, City crews are on-call day and night to assist with placing barricades at flooded washes and dip crossings.

After the floodwater recedes, Street
Maintenance crews begin evaluating
conditions of the roadway and remove any
accumulation of hazardous debris.
